The storm was moving north of Erieau. We decided to start fishing at 9 am and have weigh in at 3 pm to allow for plenty for fishing time!

The Alternative view of spending a week in Erieau: Nancy and I usually spend a week with the boat at Erieau Marina during the Metro West Tournament weekend. This year was no exception! We have not been able to go to Canada easily for the last three years; so this was a special treat to start the tradition over again. It was good to talk to Kathy, Jim and Dave about the changes that have occurred in their families.

Ontario has a DNR regulation that has a daily catch limit and the possession limit is the same. That means that when we get 12 walleye, we have to travel home and drive back to Erieau. That is not an issue in that we like to sleep in our bed a home a few nights during our week at Erieau. So we sleep on the boat until we have a limit of fish; we then go home and spend the night and go back the next day if the weather is fishable! This week we made three trips home! In total we traveled 725 miles during the week. In our F150 Lighting the trips were quiet, smooth and less expensive that previous years making the trip in our Expeditions. All charging was done at home at a cost of \$42. We saved over \$110 in energy cost and 800 pounds of carbon produced when burning gas!

On Wednesday we drove to Erieau to bring the The Alternative home and get in one more chance to catch a few walleye for the freezer! We had success! We got our limit before we pulled the boat at 7:30 pm. The last two were our biggest! Nancy caught a 4.65 walleye and then I caught a 5.2 pounder! Nice way to end the trip!

Yes, we did take the advice to check the lines frequently! We also learned that if we took the lines down to depth (40' to 50') and then release the lines and let them drift up slowly, we hooked fish on the way up! Fun to fell the fish hit the spoon!
