

Salmon in the Class Room **RELEASE** Report - May 6th and 8th

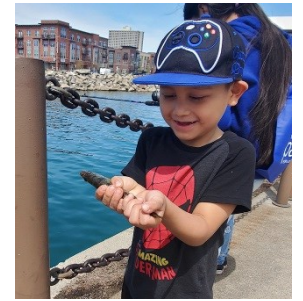
