We put another successful Kids Outing in the history books for 2023. Many changes occurred this year including a new location. Quite a few of the changes occurred behind the scenes.

The difference in those numbers was "walk-ups", meaning people who discovered the Outing the day of the event or chose not to pre-register. Since parents are required to accompany their kids the total attendance is about double the number of kids attending. The fishing was quite good too. The best example of that was a legal size or near legal size pike caught by Donnie Periard. I think everyone caught something. Most were bluegills with some kids catching 8 or 10. Jay Labban brought out his fly rod and let a bunch of kids try fishing a rubber spider off the big T-shaped dock. It was a fish on every other cast or so and a big hit with all who tried the fly rod. I gave it a try too and had a blast. Maybe I'll turn into a fly-guy, we'll have to see?

We moved to a new location for this year's Outing. The weeds were terrible at last year's event. Gary Townes broke away from last year's Outing to scout for a new location on the same lake. He came back with some very positive reports about the area near the West Boat Launch.

My Dad's neighbor, Curt Mays and his grandkids Sophia and Aiden volunteered to fish the potential new location as soon as they packed up from attending last year's Outing. My wife, Mb, and I checked on them when we had cleaned up and packed all our gear in our vehicles. We walked the shoreline for a while and checked on Curt's success. The results were all the positive things that Gary described, very few weeds, visible schools of fish and nice floating docks, bathrooms with running water plus a large, covered pavilion.

I used a more de-centralized approach to preparing the equipment and gathering the drinks this year. One of the other non-member volunteers was Karen's co-worker, again thanks to Karen! The sad part of the volunteer situation is that the Steelheader volunteers are the same people (with 3 exceptions) that have volunteered for the Outing in the past or work on Outdoorama, or work on the Ultimate Fishing Show or Salmon In The Classroom, or the Sportsman's Banquet, etc. More of the 80/20 rule.


